Construction is moving forward on Riverview 220 and Grand Vista Place! We're thrilled to announce that the waitlist for these affordable rental units will officially open in January.

Riverview 220 features a multi-use design, with retail and market space on the ground floor and affordable apartments above. The property brings both housing and community amenities to the area.

We're grateful for the outstanding work of our partners at Wolverine Building Group, and look forward to welcoming new residents soon.

# Upcoming Recertification Packets – Please Be Prepared

Recertification packets are mailed based on your annual review month. Please watch your mail and be ready to return your packet by the deadline:

- **May Annuals:** mailed by **January 15** and due **January 30**
- **June Annuals:** mailed by **February 15** and due **March 2**
- **July Annuals:** mailed by **March 15** and due **March 30**

To avoid delays, begin gathering the common documents we request each year, such as:

- Your **4 most recent pay stubs**

- **Bank statements or balance documents** for accounts like traditional banks, Cash App, and prepaid debit cards
- **Out-of-pocket medical expenses** (elderly/disabled households)
- **Childcare expenses** you pay out-of-pocket
- **Student status verification** for any full-time adult students

**New This Year: A Child Support Verification Release Form** will be included in your packet. Completing this form allows us to get child support payment information directly on your behalf, saving you the step of providing the 12-month payment history.

# Local Food Pantry Information

The Greater Lansing Food Bank and LHC partner to make sure our neighbors never go hungry. The Food Bank works with over 140 partner agencies to supply food pantries, churches, community kitchens, and more throughout mid-Michigan. ## How can I receive food?

- You can receive food through mobile food distributions or a community pantry. To find one near you, visit the pantry locator at [greaterlansingfoodbank.org/get-help/pantries](https://greaterlansingfoodbank.org/get-help/pantries).

## Who is eligible to receive food?

- No one should ever go hungry. ANYONE in need within Clare, Clinton, Eaton, Gratiot, Ingham, Isabella, and Shiawassee counties can receive food from the Food Bank's partner agencies.

## Do you need to bring an ID?

- Identification is NOT REQUIRED.

## Am I eligible for Mobile Distributions?

- Anyone in need of food is eligible!

## What do I need to know about pick up?

- You only need your name and address of residency.
- Stay in your vehicles; food is placed in the trunk!
- First come, first served! Arrive on time to ensure food!



For 24/7 assistance in locating your nearest emergency food resource, dial 2-1-1 to be connected to a United Way 2-1-1 call center location.

# Project Based Units

- If you have a **Project-Based Voucher**, it is managed by the **Lansing Housing Commission**. This means you must follow all the rules, like turning in paperwork, doing inspections and updating your information — just like other voucher holders.
- Sometimes, the office at your apartment may ask for different paperwork. That is for the **Michigan Asset Group**, and it's separate from the information needed by the Lansing Housing Commission. You must follow both sets of rules to keep your housing help.
- If your **income changes** or someone **moves in or out** of your home, you must tell Lansing Housing Commission **within 30 days**. Every adult in your home must fill out a form called the **HCV Certification Packet**. You can get it at our office at **419 Cherry Street** or on our website.
- Not sure if you live in a Project-Based Voucher unit? Ask your apartment office to help you find out.
